

Acceptable Documents To Prove Identification And Residence.

REQUIRED DOCUMENTS BY REGULATION:

Applicants for a New Mexico driver’s license must provide the following:

1. One (1) identification number
2. One (1) proof of identity
3. Two (2) proofs of residency showing a New Mexico address

NOTE: Managers should review any questionable documents. Managers have the right to refuse any questionable document and the right to request additional proof as listed below.

| <p>An original Social Security card. A driver’s license with Social Security number. Government issued photo-identification card, military identification card, educational institution identification card, an original employment payroll receipt, tax forms such as W-2, W-4, W-8, W-9 or other official IRS documents, a medical card or a statement from a financial institution containing applicant’s social security number.</p> <p>FOREIGN NATIONAL SUBSTITUTES FOR SSN: Individual Tax Identification Number Card (ITIN)—or applicant’s letter from IRS issuing the ITIN, or tax forms using the applicant’s ITIN. Valid passport issued by country of citizenship. Valid documentation issued by the INS such as an I-551 “resident alien card”, I-151 “alien registration receipt” card, I-688 “temporary resident card, or an I-797 “notice of action.” <i>Matricula Consular</i> issued by the Mexican Consulate in Albuquerque or El Paso, Texas.</p> | <p>Original or certified copy of a birth certificate. (Spanish must have a notarized English translation). Valid passport issued by country of citizenship. Indian Census card. <i>Matricula Consular</i> issued by the Mexican Consulate in Albuquerque or El Paso, TX. Current driver’s license from another state or country. I-551, I-151, or I-688. Military ID with photo. I-94 with photo.</p> <p>***EDL photo verification (Only for lost ID’s or DL’s.)</p> | <p>Rental agreement or purchase agreement. Any original government-issued document. Utility bill (water, gas, electric, waste, telephone, etc.). Insurance bill Bank statement Check book Employment pay stub Local property tax statement Proof of a minor child enrolled in a public or private school. Voter registration card Library card. Original documents from a New Mexico community service organization. Original documents from a city, county, state or federal government health or social service organization attesting to the fact that the applicant is a New Mexico resident. <i>Matricula Consular</i> issued by the Mexican Consulate in Albuquerque or El Paso, TX.</p> |
